# D.I.Y. RECYCLED SEED PAPER HEARTS

#### Materials:

- Colored Paper
- Thin Seeds
- Mixer
- Screen
- Bowl
- Heart Shaped Cookie Cutter



- 1. Tear paper into little pieces and place them into a bowl. After you have all of your paper torn up, it's time to add your warm water.
- 2. Let your paper sit in water for a couple of hours to let it soak.
- 3. After soaking, blend paper into pulp. Drain water out of the mixture, but make sure you leave it moist.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds into the pulp and hand mix well so that they are all throughout the pulp.
- 5. Place a towel underneath the screen to catch the leaking water.
- 6. Hold your cookie cutter tightly against the screen and put a spoonful of paper pulp into the shape and use the spoon to push around as even as you can.
- 7. After you have placed a few on your screen, you can place them out in the sun to dry.
- 8. Once fully dry, remove them from the screen and you're done!

## **D.I.Y. PAPER RAINBOWS**

#### Materials:

- Toilet or Paper Towel Rolls
- Elmer's Glue
- Cotton Balls
- White Construction Paper
- Paint (red, orange, yellow, green, blue and purple)



### Instructions:

- 1. Cut the paper towel/toilet paper roll into two halves.
- 2. Use the paint to paint a rainbow down the roll. Set aside to dry.
- 3. As the painted rainbow is drying, use the white construction paper to cut out two little clouds.
- 4. Once the rainbow is dry, use Elmer's glue to glue the clouds to each side of the cut roll.
- 5. Glue down cotton balls on the white construction paper clouds to help give a 3D effect!

## **LEAF PAINTING CRAFT**

### <u>Materials:</u>

- Washable Paint (colors of your choice)
- Paper
- Paintbrushes
- Container to pour paint
- Leaves

#### Instructions:

- 1. Collect leaves from outside.
- 2. Prepare your work area and paints.
- 3. Choose a leaf, flip it upside down so that the underside is now facing up.
- 4. Paint the entire leaf with your color/s of choice.
- 5. Carefully press the leaf, paint side down on to the paper and press all or the leaf to get all the paint spots.
- 6. Remove the leaf to see the beautiful print you just made.
- 7. Repeat steps 4-6 until you are satisfied.
- 8. Once satisfied, allow the paint to dry before hanging up or leaf print artwork!

## **TISSUE PAPER SUNCATCHERS**

#### **Materials:**

- Colored Tissue Paper
- Elmer's Glue
- Paintbrush
- Wax Paper
- Scissors
- String



- 1. Cut tissue paper into small pieces.
- 2. Take a piece of wax paper and start applying a thin layer of glue onto the wax paper with the paintbrush.
- 3. Time to add the tissue paper pieces into the design you want.
- 4. Add enough pieces so there are very little gaps.
- 5. Apply another layer of glue over the pieces.
- 6. Time to let it dry.
- 7. Once dry, cut into the shape you want.
- 8.Lastly, add some string to your suncatcher and hang it somewhere in your house that gets good sunlight, and enjoy your new suncatcher!

## **DIY BINOCULARS**

#### Materials:

- Toilet Paper Rolls
- Small Scraps of Cardboard
- Ribbon or String
- Paint (colors of your choice)
- Paint Brushes
- Hot Glue Gun
- Hole Puncher



#### Instructions:

- 1. Paint and decorate 2 toilet paper rolls.
- 2. Put a thin strip of hot glue down the middle of one roll and stick it to the other to make binoculars.
- 3. Cut a small strip of cardboard and glue it across the top-middle of the binoculars.
- 4. Punch a hole on the outside of each of the tubes and thread with ribbon or string.
- 5. Use your new binoculars to see some cool things!

We received a North American River Otter who needed a name, and all of you decided Stella was the perfect fit, and we couldn't agree more. Here are some screenshots from an article that the Victoria Advocate did back in 2015!

We may never know what the Texas Zoo's youngest otter calls herself in the aquatic world, but Crossroads residents will have a chance to give her a human moniker.

The final choices are Lottie, Kiki, Susie, Ariel, Stella, Lucy and Bella.

The Texas Zoo has partnered with the Victoria Advocate to create a naming contest for the river otter. Those participating are encouraged to <u>vote before Tuesday</u>.

After Victoria Advocate employees came up with 24 names, the zoo narrowed those to seven.

Wednesday, a winning name will be announced for the unnamed furry creature.

The otter shares its exhibit with Sammy, an older male, said Michael Magaw, the zoo's curator of animals. Both were procured from a facility in South Carolina months earlier in 2015, he said.

## **FIREWORK PAINTING!**

#### Materials:

- 3 empty toilet paper rolls (a paper towel roll can also we used if cut in thirds)
- 3 paper plates for each roll
- Red, White, and Blue paint
- Black construction paper
- Scissors

### **Instructions:**

- 1. Holding your toilet paper roll vertically, cut a vertical line about 1/3 up on the end. Then, continue cutting vertical lines at the same 1/3 mark every 1/2 inch or so all the way around.
- 2. Once the end is all cut, carefully press the cardboard pieces out so it looks like a firework.
- 3. Use a separate paper plate for each color of paint.
- 4. Lastly, dip your toilet paper roll into the paint and begin to stamp your paper.

TIP: It is an easier application to use less paint on the roll. A fun way to create your own fireworks is by layering the colors. You do not need to wait for your paint to dry after each layer. Keep going until you have achieved your ideal finished product.

## **D.I.Y. PAINT POPSICLES**

- 1. Fill each paper cup with paint You can add one color of paint to each cup or several colors to each cup by layering the paint.
- 2. Add a popsicle stick Once each cup is filled to your liking, add a small piece of aluminum foil across the top of the cup, cut a small hole, and push the popsicle stick through the hole to keep it in place.
- 3. Freeze Transfer to the freezer overnight to freeze.
- 4. Time to Paint! Now that your popsicles are frozen solid, gently peel away the paper cup to reveal the paint. Now on your white paper, paint by holding onto the stick.




# KEEPER OF THE MONTH!
